


Give the Gift of Christian Education



Campus Enhancement: Auditorium Stage

This building has so much potential to become even more! By investing in its renovation, we can transform it into a space that not only preserves its historical significance but also enhances its functionality and appeal for future generations.





This renovation will include:

- Repairing and expanding the stage floor
- Replacing the temporary stage creating more usable space with great visibility
- Adding a curved sound wall, additional lighting and LED video panel on the back wall
- Installing a lighting gallery for better access to spotlights and update AV equipment
- Adding safety handrail for stage steps

WHY I GIVE?

When I was a child, my parents were committed to sending my sisters and me to Adventist schools. At that time, no scholarship programs or worthy student funds were available, which made it challenging for my parents—especially when my older sister and I were in academy and my youngest sister was still in elementary school.

I attended an Adventist academy in Iowa for three years, and to help with tuition, I worked a minimum of four hours a day. During my third year, I worked eight hours Monday through Thursday and all day on Sunday to cover my expenses. Despite my efforts, my parents still struggled to keep up with the payments, and every month I was called into the finance office to answer the same question: "When will your parents pay your bill?" At the end of my junior year, due to the financial strain and my experience in Iowa, my parents decided to transfer me to Wisconsin Academy for my senior year.

After graduating from Wisconsin Academy, I had ambitions of going to college to become a nurse. However, I encountered a major obstacle in the process of applying for the college of my choice.

I discovered that the Iowa academy would not release my transcripts until my bill was paid in full. Instead of going to college right after academy, I stayed home and worked in a factory to pay off my academy debt. Despite my dedication and having a well-paying job for someone without a college degree, it still took me a full year to pay off the bill, sending 80% of my paycheck each week.

Many of my classmates and advisors warned me that if I didn't go to college immediately after graduation, I might never go at all.

Statistics show that fewer than 3% of students who take a gap year after high school ever enroll in college. But I was determined. After paying off my academy bill, I reached my goal of attending college. I graduated from Southern Missionary College—now Southern Adventist University—with a degree in nursing, one of the greatest achievements of my life!

Because of my challenging experience during academy, my husband, Randy, and I felt compelled to donate so that no student attending Thunderbird Academy would have to endure the same struggles I faced. I believe God allowed me to go through that experience and placed a burden on my heart to give as much as we could to prevent others from facing delays in graduating or attending college. Although we donate anonymously, we have received numerous thank-you notes from students (who didn't know who they were thanking), and it fills our hearts with joy to give and help where we can.

Randy and I see supporting the students at Thunderbird Academy as missionary work right here at home. We believe that every student who attends an Adventist college has tremendous potential to further the gospel and bring others to Jesus. I pray we will see these students—and those they have led to Christ—when Jesus returns to take us all home in the clouds of glory!






NEWEST ALUMNI GIVE BACKWITH CAFE 24'

TAA is making significant progress on the solar panel project and is currently awaiting final permits from the City of Scottsdale. Solar panels will be installed on shade structures around the cafeteria and carports in the parking lots. Once completed, these panels are expected to reduce the campus's electricity bill to nearly, if not completely, net zero.

With the installation of these panels, TAA will be able to power all school facilities, including classrooms, administrative offices, dormitories, the cafeteria, and the gymnasium. This is an exciting time for our school as we take advantage of Arizona's abundant sunshine, paving the way for a more sustainable future on our campus.
